GENERAL INFORMATION

REGISTRATION

Students will be emailed a Google Form on which to rank their course preferences. Registration priority may be given to upperclassmen. However, all students should understand that class choice may not be guaranteed due to class size limits. Final schedules will be available in FACTS prior to Christmas break.

LOCATION

Winterim classes may be offered both on and off campus depending on the nature of the class. Permission slips will be needed for students driving to Winterim destinations that are not at school. Permission slips will also be needed for students to ride with another student to Winterim locations that are not at school. If permission is not given the student must take all Winterim classes and eat lunch on campus. Please find the permission slips located on the last page of the Winterim Registration Catalog. Locations are listed in the course descriptions and on the master schedule.

winterim policies

Credits

Winterim credits are required for graduation. Students will earn a total of 0.5 elective credits per Winterim. This credit is earned by taking two half-day classes. Winterim courses may not be substituted for regular courses required for graduation. Please see the Student Academic Pathway for further information regarding credits and overall graduation requirements.

Attendance

Due to the concentrated framework of Winterim, consistent attendance is very important. Parents are strongly discouraged from stretching Christmas vacation into Winterim.

Even one absence is significant and may result in students being ineligible to pass the course. Absences will be considered on an individual basis, taking into account the purpose or reason of the absence and whether arrangements can be made to make up for missed work.

Pass/Fail

All Winterim courses will be graded on a Pass/Fail basis. A failed Winterim course must be made up through an assigned Independent Study arranged with administration.

Fees

Some project-based Winterim courses will require a fee to supplement the cost of materials. Fees are listed in the course descriptions and are due at the HS Office by December 20, 2025. Checks should be written out to Central.

If materials are needed for the course, instructors will communicate those items to students after registration is finalized. Students will meet with their instructors on December 15th during squads and 15 minutes during the noon lunch break to get a introduction to the courses they are registered for.

We'll look at how to hunt an area successfully based on the information we found.

Additionally, students will reflect on how the ideas of calling and sacrifice lie at the heart of the Christian life.

Community Emergency Preparedness & Response Class

Join this fun and interactive class where you'll begin the week learning First Aid using Chain of Survival to teach the basics, including injury prevention, and when to get help. You'll end the week learning CPR, how to use an Automated External Defibrillator (AED), and help someone who is choking. You will also explore the Prinsburg fire hall including the first responder vehicle and fire trucks, along with a tour of the Raymond ambulance. Cory Thorson, sales manager from Alex Air Apparatus will be on site to showcase different equipment and discuss and demonstrate how it supports rescue operations. At the end of this class you will be dual certified in First Aid and CPR from the American Heart Association and on your way to becoming an important part of your community who will be able to act confidently in emergencies.

Fishing Basics

You'll then learn about several different species of fish and how to target them at different times of the year. We'll look at lake maps to determine the best locations on local lakes to find fish.

After that you'll hone/build your skills by having casting competitions (casting into a circle and pail, and skipping your lure under structure). These will be at varying distances and will help with casting accuracy.

If you don't have a rod/reel or tackle, I'll have plenty that you can use. You can bring your own if you have it.

This course is going to be geared towards the new fisherman/fisherwoman, so if you're a seasoned angler this course might not be for you.
