SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Being involved is the best way to be a part of the school community. We value being Better Together and can do this by serving alongside one another. Here are some of the opportunities to serve in our school:

School Board

This governing body, consisting of 10 directors, works closely with the Superintendent as the vision-keepers of our school's mission, vision, and values.

Finance Committee

This committee guides the financial health of our organization through long-range planning, budgeting, and the financial aid process.

Education Committee

This committee is responsible for reviewing the educational plans and policies and ensuring that they align with the school's mission, vision, and values. They also review testing practices, results, and reporting.

Advancement Committee

This committee guides our fund development policies, enrollment development, volunteer management, and advancement plans.

Governance Committee

This committee oversees the committee mandates and reviews the policies, by-laws & constitution of the school to ensure that they are consistent with our practices.

Athletic Committee

This committee helps to guide our athletic policies and provides general support for the athletic department. The Tournament Committee is a sub-committee that helps plan and execute the various tournaments.

New 2 You Advisory Committee

This committee supports the store's efforts, community involvement & volunteers and offers support to the staff.

Legacy Committee

This committee plans and executes this annual spring event that helps generate funds for the special projects that benefit our staff and students.

Freedom Fun Days Committee

This committee plans and executes this summer event which includes a dinner, parade, inflatables, softball tournament, and entertainment before the fireworks.

Harvest Festival Committee

This committee plans and executes this annual fall event that helps generate funds that benefit our staff and students. The event includes a ham dinner, kids carnival, snack booths, and a live & silent auction.

SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

Open House (the week before the school year begins)

Meet your teachers, see your classrooms, and take your school picture.

Middle and High School Retreat (September)

 These parent-led events are intended to build community and deepen our student's relationship with Jesus. Typically 2-3 days long, from Friday-Saturday/Sunday.

Athletic Orientation Meeting (August - before fall sports practices begin)

 All athletes and parents are encouraged to attend to review athletic policies & forms and connect with the coaches.

Ecology Trip

 Offered to students who take Ecology and provides a 3-day experience up north to enhance their classroom learning.

Harvest Festival (3rd Saturday of November)

- One of our largest fundraisers of the year. Each family is asked to serve during this event.
- Includes many activities and booths, as well as Live and Silent auctions.

Washington DC Trip (November)

 Offered to our senior students who take government classes and provides an opportunity to extend the classroom learning experience to our nation's capital.

Fall and Spring Conferences (November/February)

An opportunity to connect one-on-one with teachers during the fall and spring.

SCHOOL ACTIVITIES CONT'D

Winterim (January - the week after Christmas break)

This week-long program takes place at the end of 1st semester for high school students. It was
created, so students have a purposeful learning experience beyond the traditional classroom and
an opportunity to explore areas of interest.

Spiritual Emphasis Week (February/March)

A week of intentional time set aside to encourage our students to deepen their faith.

Central Showcase (March)

 This is our academic showcase where all our students display art projects, classroom projects, our live 5th-grade wax museum, and much more.

Annual Meeting (2nd Tuesday in April)

• This is our annual meeting for all families and constituents, where we update you on the school finances, academic programming, and other pertinent information.

Middle School Science Camp / Camp Encounter

 Offered to 6th & 7th-grade students and provides a 2-day camp experience in the Spicer area to enhance classroom learning.

Mission Trips (April)

 Our juniors and seniors have the opportunity to go on a mission trip sponsored by area leaders in the spring that is either work or evangelism-focused.

Grandparent's Day (April)

A special day for our K-5th grade students and their grandparents.

High School & Middle School Orientation

- Incoming 9th graders are invited to a special evening where they register for classes and learn more about high school.
- Incoming 6th graders and parents are invited to a special meeting where they learn more about middle school.

Prom (First weekend in May)

Junior & Senior students enjoy a special evening with a grand march and a banquet.



- · A web browser displays your Name and Family Portal Person ID.
- Type a User Name, Password, and Confirm the password.
- Click Save User Name and/or Password. A message displays at the top of the browser, "User Name/Password successfully updated."
- You may now log in to FACTS Family Portal using your new User Name and Password.

 - Progress reports, reports cards and transcripts
 - Lunch menus/order forms o Family/staff directory
 - Update your family contact info/emergency contact info o FACTS/tuition info
