In Governor Walz's proposed two-year state budget, he included eliminating two very critical services to nonpublic students and families – <u>aids to nonpublic pupils</u> and nonpublic pupil transportation aid.

More than 50 years ago, Minnesota made a statutory commitment to provide certain services and supports to ALL students, regardless of where they received their education. We consider these as "common good" services – safe transportation to and from school, textbooks and educational aids for student learning, nursing services and counseling to support students and their mental health. For more than 5 decades, regardless of legislative makeup and/or good or bad budget situations, these services have endured. Elimination of these services would impact the students and families that rely on these services the most – working families (multiple jobs), students needing mental health help, and families in rural areas with limited transportation options.

What can you do? Raise your voice! It's simple!

- Contact your local legislator (house and senate) and tell them to oppose
 the elimination of these services that support students and families in your
 community.
