CKLA helps educators teach students to read through engaging lessons in Social Studies, Science, and Literature.

- 6. Book Club was led by Christy G from Chapter 16 of Guiding Schools to Flourish on the subject of Thirty Years a Board Member...Some lessons learned.
- 7. Reviewed the rosters for Board Committees and the New to You task force.
- 8. Jon DG explained the VTO 5-year plan and how the annual goals are being worked towards strategically through the use of each of the leadership team annual work plans. Committee work plans will be reviewed next month.
- 9. The Governance Committee asked for a Conflict of Interest document to be signed by each member.
- 10. Roundtable:
- a) More discussion will take place on how to invite others to the upcoming Willie Robertson chapel in November.
- b) Jon DG will check with those responsible to ensure that the soccer field is ready for the upcoming season.
- c) Due to timing, administration will revise the exam policy with an email Board vote in order to get it into this year's policy handbook.

>>> NEW TO YOU UPDATE <




At Central, we value bridging the gap in our community through service. One of the most unique ways we are able to do that is through our thrift store. New to You.

As the need for affordable goods and desire for sustainable living continue to grow, New to You is rising to meet these demands and working with Central leadership on a vision for the future – including a possible second location.

With changing consumer habits, national research shows that thrift is a rapidly growing industry. New to You is not only in line with market growth but 60 is outpacing national numbers.

In recent years, New to You has worked hard to set itself apart from other merchants with its missiondriven message, Good News retail department, and donation incentive program.

Community support and the store's ability to adapt to change are reflected in their most recent earnings report. In 2017, New to You's revenue was \$474,500. This year, the store exceeded \$1,003,000 – a 211% increase.



But growth comes with its own set of challenges. Currently, maxed out at the 1st street location, New to You is faced with turning away donations and limiting their marketing. To continue serving our community and unlocking new possibilities, the New to You Task Force has begun to explore future opportunities – including the prospect of opening a second location.

An expansion could not only help manage the demand for service and influx of donations but also allow the store to delve into wholesale baling. Currently culled and vetted clothing is given away at the store's cost, to a wholesaler. Implementing their own baling could raise an additional \$10k-12k per month in revenue.

Based on current metrics and trend data, New to You expects opening a new store could increase revenue by at least 80% and the monthly payout to Central by 100%.

With every new donation, New to You has worked creatively to make the existing space work. In the interim, as long-term solutions are explored and the store approaches it's busy season, the task force is looking for additional storage space.

Recognizing the need for expansion, leadership is considering an array of solutions and asks for the prayerful support of the Central community as they determine the best way forward for both our community and school.
