STUDENTS WILL FIND THEIR CALLING IN GOD'S WORLD...

I hope every student at Central experiences disappointment... that leads to growth. Not unnecessary pain from bad choices or bad planning (though those, too, can hold lessons) but the kind of hard moments that prepare them for life. Because life is full of hard. For some students, the challenge will be social or emotional; for others, academic.

Our role as a school is to partner with you in setting a high standard and then coming alongside students with high support. Our approach is not an either-or between sink-or-swim or opting out. You're going to swim, and we'll teach you how, even if you're afraid of the water. You might get a bad grade, and we'll help you understand why, even if you don't think the grade was fair. You may be teased or say something unkind, and we'll walk with you toward better interactions, and there may be consequences for your responses. But we'll get through, and learn from it, together.

Books today talk often about grit. And much blame gets cast on bad parenting and social media, and those things matter, but underneath it all is this: many students (and adults) simply haven't been taught how to handle disappointment well.

Acknowledge what is. (reality) Grieve what isn't. (emotions) Change what you can. (agency) Accept and move forward. (resolve)

Jesus said, "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." (John 16:33). Our students will manage disappointments and overcome hard things in God's world through an exceptional education delivered from a biblical worldview.




LIVING A LIFE OF SERVICE
